AIDEA Supports Workforce Development Agreement Between JAG Marine and Generations Southeast Vocational Training Center

Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority (AIDEA), JAG Maring Group, and Generations Southeast Vocational Training Center announced a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to work together and promote Workforce training efforts for Alaskans to be employed in the shipyard repair and construction industry.

JAG Marine Group operates the Seward and Ketchikan shipyards. AIDEA owns the Ketchikan shipyard. JAG has significantly increased business and job opportunities at the Ketchikan shipyard since it took over a few months ago.

Generations Southeast provides Vocational training for Alaskans through multiple facilities and through virtual classes. Generations Southeast is supported by Central Council Tlingit-Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska, Sealaska Corporation, and the State of Alaska.

Doug Huff, JAG said "There are tremendous opportunities to work in the shipyard and maritime industry in Alaska. This MOU and the efforts of our partners to train Alaskans will provide family wage blue collar jobs to Alaskans right out of high school. And another leg to the economy in Southeast Alaska."

“This is a statewide effort, and the shipyard presents a real opportunity to create local jobs in Southeast Alaska,” **said Tlingit & Haida President Chalyee Éesh Richard Peterson.**

“Too often, Alaskans leave because they believe there are no opportunities here at home. Tlingit & Haida, through Generations Southeast, is prepared and willing to take on this opportunity for our region by developing shipyard-specific, certified training in partnership with industry and state agencies, so Alaska jobs can be filled by Alaska workers.”

“Expanding marine construction is vital to economic growth in Ketchikan, and I strongly support partnerships that equip Alaskans with the training needed for high-quality jobs. These collaborations play a critical role in building a skilled workforce that meets state and regional labor demands, strengthens long-term economic growth, and helps keep families, jobs, and students in our communities,” **said Alaska State Senator Bert Stedman.**

Alaska Representative Jeremy T. Bynum stated “This partnership is exactly what Southeast Alaska needs: career training connected directly to real jobs. I have consistently supported technical readiness and career training because it is the foundation for a strong workforce and a strong economy. “This MOU creates a clear pathway from training to employment by aligning workforce education with the real needs of Alaska’s shipyards.
